

 - 2. Defining the problem. Define the problem or problems to be discussed.
 - 3. Brainstorming.
 - 4. Structuring and hypothesis.
 - 5. Set Learning objectives.
 - 6. Searching for Information.
 - 7. Discussion.
 - 8. Feedback.



Doing PBL in corona-times

• Usually: 7-step approach:

1. Clarifying terms. Identify and clarify unfamiliar terms presented in the scenario. 2. Defining the problem. Define the problem or problems to be discussed. prediscus 3. Brainstorming. 4. Structuring and hypothesis. sion you discussing @Canvas 5. Set Learning objectives. 6. Searching for Information. **—— you reading @home (take notes!)** 7. Discussion. **Post-Discussion (=actual tutorial)** 8. Feedback.
